

## Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost

The College of Charleston is seeking a strategic and dynamic provost, with a strong portfolio of research, academic and leadership accomplishments. Reporting to the President, and serving as a key member of the President's executive team, the Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost is expected to engage and lead the faculty to garner new levels of achievement and institutional prestige. The following positions report to the provost: deans of the schools, honors program, graduate school, library, and summer programs; vice presidents for enrollment planning and the academic experience; directors of institutional research, international programs, and accreditation and assessment; and registrar.

The College of Charleston is a nationally recognized public liberal arts and sciences university located in historic Charleston, South Carolina. Founded in 1770, the College prepares more than 10,000 undergraduates and more than 1,500 graduate students for their careers and for their lives through an innovative and practical liberal arts and sciences experience, with an opportunity for professional preparation in a wide variety of fields. An honors college of approximately 600 high-achieving students (with an average SAT of 1340) rivals the best liberal arts and sciences colleges in the country. Students choose the College for its combination of small-college attributes — especially the close relationships between faculty and students — coupled with the advantages and diversity of an urban, mid-sized university. The College offers a rigorous curriculum grounded in a broad general education program and enriched by the availability of 46 majors and 82 minors, as well as numerous interdisciplinary offerings and programs. The academic life of students begins in general education and develops in the six schools: School of the Arts; School of Business and Economics; School of Education, Health, and Human Performance; School of Humanities and Social Sciences; School of Languages, Cultures, and World Affairs; and the School of Sciences and Mathematics.

The ideal candidate will have a demonstrated commitment to liberal arts education, a passion for scholarship and teaching, and a record of personal academic accomplishment and resource development including successful experience as a dean or academic leader. Academic rank equivalent to full professor is desirable.
